Appointed for two years from 2016 to 2018 Peter holds a statutory Assistant Commissioner position at the New South Wales Crime Commission in Australia. The Commission is established under an Act of Parliament to assist law enforcement to reduce organised and other serious crime by using coercive powers unavailable through normal policing methods. Prior to that appointment, Peter worked as a threat and risk management consultant for 18 months after finishing over four decades as an Australian police officer.

He was the Assistant Commissioner in charge of the Counter Terrorism & Special Tactics Command at the time of his retirement from the New South Wales Police Force in 2014, a force with 21,000 members and a budget over \$3billion. His policing service involved major crime investigative and high risk national security commands. His experience included SWAT, specialist investigation, threat assessment and risk management in areas such as violent crime, kidnap for ransom, extortion and CT operations.

His last police command involved building bridges and collaborating with government, policing and intelligence agencies and trusted industry partners. During his career Peter conducted research in the UK, USA, France, Italy and Canada in relation to violent crime, national security and high risk policing. His academic qualifications include a Bachelor of Laws Degree. He is a graduate of the 2007 LinCT program, was the 2013-14 LinCT-AA President and has been involved in all LinCT-AA annual conferences. Peter has been awarded leadership citations, commendation medals and the Australian Police Medal for distinguished service.
