

Assistant Chief Constable Tim Jacques

Tim Jacques is an Assistant Chief Constable and the Deputy Senior National Coordinator (D/SNC) for the UK's Counter Terrorism Policing Network, based in New Scotland Yard.

Counter Terrorism Policing is an 8000 people strong collaboration of UK Police Forces who work with the United Kingdom's Intelligence Agencies, Her Majesty's Government, the Ministry of Defence and other partners to counter the threat to UK interests from all forms of Terrorism.

It separately leads UK investigations into Hostile State Activity, Official Secrets Act offences and War Crimes. The D/SNC role supports the Senior National Co-ordinator (SNC) in overseeing all such investigations (presently circa 800), agreeing thresholds for executive action and taking direct command and control in high threat or attack response situations.

Tim began his policing career in 1986 with Lancashire Constabulary working through the ranks in the North West of England in intelligence and investigative roles up to and including the role of Detective Superintendent, Head of Intelligence and CT. Whilst doing so he was additionally an authorised firearms officer, a hostage negotiator and a firearms incident commander for over 15 years.

In 2007 he was promoted to Chief Superintendent and in 2010 attending the UK Strategic Command Course, he was promoted to Assistant Chief Constable in his home force, responsible for CT, Specialist Crime & Specialist Operations functions. He was the North West of England's lead for armed policing and became a UK CT Commander in 2015, performing this role in response to the Manchester Arena Suicide Bomb Attack in May 2017.
